## Early Elementary (7-8 years old on September 1, 2022)

### 1<sup>ST</sup> PERIOD

#### **Beginning Fencing (\$65 class fee) (W. Trapani)**

The class will begin with a historical perspective of sword fighting through lecture and video presentation. The most important skill needed to become an excellent fencer is footwork. Before students can hold and fight with a sword, they must learn how to stand en garde, advance, retreat, and lunge. Throughout the semester, footwork will be emphasized each week. Once students demonstrate their footwork competently, they are introduced to holding a wooden dowel as their "sword." The students then learn how to respect the wooden dowel, moving the dowel to all the various positions of defense. Once the students demonstrate proficiency and safe use of their dowels, the students are then issued plastic swords and masks. Our fencers can now learn how to defend, attack and counterattack their opponents through the use of drills. Beginning in the 5th or 6th week students learn rules for conduct during the fencing bout. ### **Intermediate Jewelry Making (\$30 class fee) (J. Pederson) TWO PERIOD CLASS (1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup>) Fee including take home supply kit and consumables for class. Must have already taken Beginning Jewelry Making**

In this 2-hour class, we will use our skills from Beginning Jewelry Making and focus them in three areas: clay, wire, and beads. We will use a variety of techniques to create designs with clay for use in earrings, bead making, barrettes, and more! Students will also mold and hammer metal wire to form rings, earrings, and ear cuffs. We will also be using beads to create intricate embroidery patterns on hoops for earrings or pendants, charm bracelets, and sophisticated beaded necklaces.
